Academia Mexicana de Historia Honors Stanley R. Ross

Stanley R. Ross (UT Austin) was inducted as a corresponding member of the Academia Mexicana de Historia on April 10, 1984, in Mexico City. **Edmundo O'Gorman** was the presiding officer and was assisted by **Jesús Reyes Heroles** (Secretario de Educación Pública) and **Miguel León-Portilla** (UNAM) in the ceremonies. Ross presented a paper entitled "El caso del periódico prerevolucionario: *El Hijo del Fantasma,* 1909-1910" to the gathering of scholars. **Josefina Zoraida Yázquez** (COLMEX) responded to his paper and then spoke of Ross's career and many accomplishments. **Ermilo J. Marroquín** (ANUIES), **James W. Wilkie** (UCLA), **Carmen Tagüeña Parga** (UNAM), and **Julia Martínez Fernández** (UNAM) also attended the ceremony.

The Academia Mexicana de Historia was founded in Mexico City in 1919 as a correspondent of the Real Academia in Madrid. This prestigious Mexican academy has bestowed such honors on just a handful of individuals from the United States.

Ross is an authority on twentieth- century Mexican history and is holder of the C. B. Smith Sr. Centennial Chair in United States-Mexico Relations at UT Austin. In September 1983 Ross received the Order of the Aztec Eagle medallion.
